- 7^d That there be a Division made of such a part of the Common and undivided Lands in Said Town as will amount to thirty Acres to a whole Shear and in that Proportion to the several parts of a Shear that were allowed to the respective Inhabitants of Said Dover by y^e Committee appointed to proportion and Distribute the said Common and undivided Lands among the Inhabitants of Said Town
- 8^d That Each Proprietor or person who hath a part allowed him in y^e said Common and undivided Lands shall have the Liberty to Draw a Certain Number in order to know his or their turn to Lay out his or their Lot or Lots in y^e said Common and undivided Lands in Said Town

9th That Such persons who have fenced in the Town Commons with a Grant therefor shall have their Proportion of thirty acres allowed them in the said Land so fenced in, if the Committee and they can agree according to a former Vote passed in Publick Town Meeting whereby the said Committee are empowered to agree with such persons as have so fenced in the said Commons

10th That Each Proprietor or Person, who hath a part allowed him in the said Commons and undivided Lands shall have the Liberty to Lay out his Lot in his proper turn in said Commons where he shall see meet so that it be Adjoyning to some particular Propriety and Lay out in such form, as the Committee appointed to Lay out the said Lots shall think proper

and then the Moderator Adjourned the meeting untill Monday the Twentieth Day of this Instant may at ten a Clock in the fore noon

At a Publick Town Meeting held by Adjournment at the Meeting House at Cokerka in Dover on the 20th Day of May 1734. Capt. Tho: Millitt being the Moderator for said meeting at which time the Inhabitants of said Town passed the following Votes viz,

Voted 5th That the Committee which was Chosen to Lay out the Common Land in Dover shall ^{have} 6 Shillings per Diem for their Service and no more. Praying a Part in the Common Lands of Dover were put to vote in Publick Town meeting and pass'd in the Negative

Wm Weymouth, Petitioned a second time to y^e Town, for two third of a Share in y^e Common, and it was granted

At the same meeting, John Tibbits Junr, Ezekiel Wentworth, Joshua Promwell, John Pinkham, John Gorton, and Thomas Austin, petitioned to the Town, for a Share in y^e Common Lands, and their Petitions being put to vote in publick Town meeting they all pass'd in y^e Negative.

At the same meeting Mary Saunders Petitioned to the Town in the following manner — To the Inhabitants of the Town of Dover in Town Meeting Assembled May 20th 1734 —

The Humble Petition, of Mary Saunders sheweth, that where as your Petitioner, is a poor Widow, tho, a Town born, child and where as she hath Erected a small house on the Commons & there lying near or bordering on said House lot of about a Quarter of an acre that she can easily fence in, your Petitioner Humbly Craves you would Grant her the above, land & your Petitioner shall ever pray as it is Duty bound —

The above Petition, was put to vote in publick Town meeting and was accordingly granted.

At the foregoing Meeting Sam: Varney, and Sam: Jones Jun^r petitioned to the Town for a Share in, of Common Lands in, said Town, whose Petitions were put to vote in, Publi^k Town: Meeting and of Town: Did accordingly vote that the above said Sam: Varney and Sam: Jones Jun^r should each of them have one third of a Share in, of said Commons.

At the same meeting Stephen Otis, and several others, petitioned to the Town, for a small Tract of Land, to be Common where William Dams and Clement Drows Windmill now stands upon Judson Hill, for of Convenience of said Mill, which they say will be one acre of Land - such Petition, was put to vote in, Publi^k Town Meeting and passed in, of Negative.

At the same time Joseph Sheffield petitioned to the Town, for a high way, of a Rod wide, from his Land, which lays between Tobias and Benj: Harrons Land, and Pekecha River, to the County Road. which Petition, was put to vote in, Publi^k Town Meeting and passed in, of Negative.

At the same Meeting the several Persons who had a part allowed them in the Common Lands in Dover drew their several Lots, the numbers of which are accordingly affixed to their names which are recorded in this Book in Pages 211, 212, 213, 214, 215, 216, 217, and 218.
