Developing a Wayfinding System


Wayfinding design is the process of organizing spatial and environmental information to help users find their way.

Wayfinding should not be considered a separate or different activity from traditional "signage design", but rather a broader, more inclusive way of assessing all the environmental issues which affect our ability to find our way.

- Placemaking capitalizes on a community's assets, inspiration, and potential.






















































































