## Budget workshops, presentations continue next week

The City Council's next budget workshop is Wednesday, April 17, beginning at 7 p.m. During the workshop the Council will review the proposed budgets for the Police, Fire, Recreation and Welfare departments. At a previous workshop, the Council reviewed the proposed budgets for the Education, Executive, Finance, Planning, the Library, and DoverNet. A public hearing on the school portion of the budget was held on Wednesday, April 10. The meeting can be viewed here.





## Road closures, traffic restrictions in place Saturday for road race

Dover Police Chief William Breault announces the following road closures for the 7th annual SMA 5K run/walk event on Saturday, April 13, 2019, part of the Dover Race Series. More information is available at <a href="http://saintmaryacademy.org/sma-5k/">http://saintmaryacademy.org/sma-5k/</a>.

The event begins at 9 a.m. on Church Street. The course ends at the same location.

Road closures include:

- Church Street, 8 to 11 a.m.
- Locust Street, between Silver and Kirkland Streets, 9:10 to 10 a.m.
- Locust Street, between Trakey Street and Central Avenue, 9 to 9:30 a.m.
- Atkinson and Belknap streets, 9 to 10 a.m.
- Fisher Street, 9 to 10 a.m.

Additional brief closures or traffic delays will be in effect in the downtown area near City Hall to accommodate the start of the race at 9 a.m. Drivers and residents will encounter delays

on other streets along the course including Rutland, Elm, Belknap, Trakey, Summer, and Nelson streets between 9 and 10 a.m.

The course includes a portion of Dover's Community Trail between Fisher and Folsom streets.

Parking restrictions will be in effect on Church Street on Saturday until 11 a.m. Event participants may park in the municipal parking garage on Orchard Street or in any other downtown municipal lot.

## Listening sessions for Route 108 improvements continue

The New Hampshire Department of Transportation (NHDOT) will hold a public listening session in Somersworth on Thursday, May 2, 2019 to discuss proposed improvements to New Hampshire Route 108 in Dover, Somersworth, and Rochester. The public is invited and encouraged to attend to provide input on potential improvements.

A listening session was previously held in Dover in March.

The May 2 public listening session will be held at Somersworth High School, 18 Cemetery Road, beginning at 7 p.m. and ending at 9 p.m. A short presentation will be followed by open discussion of ideas and dialogue between the public and the NHDOT project team.

This project involves the study of improvements to NH Route 108 from the intersection of NH Route 9/Indian Brook Drive in Dover to Innovation Drive in Rochester, a distance of approximately five miles. The objective of the project is to develop a design alternative that will improve the safety and mobility of all users by applying 'Complete Street' principles, with the central goal of achieving an appropriate balance between the needs of motorized, non-motorized, and transit users of the corridor.

Interested property owners, public officials, employers and roadway users are welcome and will be given the opportunity to provide input on the project.

TDD access: Relay NH 1-800-735-2964. Notification of the need for assistance must be made at the

earliest convenience.

Historic properties may be impacted by the project. Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act offers those that possess a direct interest in historical resources, including town officials, Historical Societies, and Historical Commissions, an opportunity to become more involved in an advisory role during project development as "Consulting Parties." Those interested should contact the NHDOT.

The following events are recorded in "Notable Events in the History of Dover, New Hampshire: From the First Settlement in 1623 to 1865," by George Wadleigh, and several other historical sources.

For more on the history of Dover, settled in 1623 and the oldest permanent settlement in New Hampshire and seventh

oldest in the country, visit the Dover Public Library, Locust Street; and the Woodman Museum, Central Avenue. The Public Library also maintains an online collection of historical information, located here.



April 13, 1830 - Hon. Daniel M. Durell of Dover, appointed a Director of the United States Bank; also, U. S. District Attorney for New Hampshire. On the same day, the river and harbor bill, containing an appropriation of \$4,200, for improving the Cochecho branch of the Piscataqua River from Dover Falls to its confluence with the Piscataqua, was vetoed by President Jackson.



**April 17, 1847** - The Calico Printery at Bellamy burns down. The loss is stated to be \$4,000 to \$5,000.



**April 16, 1850** - "Six inches of snow on the ground, and the weather more like midwinter than the middle of the second month of spring."



April 17, 1862 - The ice went out of the Cochecho last week and the Portsmouth Journal announces the first arrival of the season from up river - "Lalla Rookh, Freeman, Dover." Now that navigation is reopened the two cities will be 50 or 100 miles nearer each other and doubtless better acquainted for a season. (Dover Enquirer)



April, 1984 - Two struggling artists living in Dover -- Kevin Eastman and Peter Laird -- release a self-published, black-and-white comic book created in their living room. After a United Press International story about the comic book, interest in the comic book skyrockets. The comic book, "Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles," would go on to spawn a lucrative franchise that includes comic books, toys, and television series and feature films.

Dover's 400th Anniversary Committee will host a public forum to ask Dover residents for input on activities to celebrate Dover's 400th birthday in 2023. The forum will be held on Thursday, May 2, 2019 at 7 p.m. in the auditorium at Dover High School.

Established in 1623, Dover is the first permanent settlement in New Hampshire. The 400th Anniversary Committee was formed to plan and organize the city's 400th birthday celebration which will include historical re-enactments, fireworks and parades, school involvement,

souvenirs and more.

"We want to hear from the public about the events and programs they'd like to see shape our celebration," said Committee Chair Kevin McEneaney.

Feedback from the forum will be brought back to the committee and incorporated into event planning documents.


## Dover Historical Society to meet on April 15

Dover's original historical society disbanded in 2008 after 108 years in existence. On Feb. 11, an enthusiastic group of 85 people met to share ideas on reviving the Society. An Executive Committee was recruited from among volunteers, and they have invited everyone with an interest in Dover history to attend the second organizational meeting of the new Dover Historical Society on Monday, April 15 at the Dover Public Library at 7 p.m.

A Nominating Committee will be submitting a proposed slate of officers, but nominations will be also be taken from the floor for anyone who might be interested in serving. The group seeks to be inclusive, and desires input from any historically-minded citizens. Further discussions at the meeting will determine the new Society's goals, roles, and direction.

In just four years, Dover will be celebrating its 400th anniversary. Dover was the first permanent settlement in New Hampshire, in 1623, and is the seventh oldest community in the United States. The new Dover Historical Society believes that a city with as much history as Dover needs to have an active and vital organization to preserve and promote our four centuries of existence.
