Spaulding Turnpike's Exit 6 northbound on-ramp now open

The New Hampshire Department of Transportation (NHDOT) announces the opening of the Spaulding Turnpike (NH 16) Exit 6 northbound on ramp in Dover.

Motorists travelling westbound on Dover Point Road/US Route 4 from Dover can now access the new Exit 6 northbound on ramp from the signalized intersection where the Exit 6 northbound off ramp meets Dover Point Road/US Route 4. There is currently no access to the Exit 6 northbound on ramp for eastbound US Route 4 traffic coming from Durham.

The work is part of the Newington-Dover 11238Q project. Severino Trucking Company, Inc. of Candia New Hampshire is the prime contractor for the \$67 million project, which is scheduled to be completed in October 2020.



Filing period for municipal election opens Sept. 9

The filing period for the City of Dover municipal election begins Monday, Sept. 9, 2019, at 8:30 a.m. and ends Friday, Sept. 20, at 4 p.m.

The municipal election is Tuesday, Nov. 5, 2019.

Candidates for City Council, School Board, and all ward positions, must be a registered voter in Dover and complete the necessary filing paperwork at the City Clerk's office, located at City Hall. A valid driver's license or passport is required at the time of filing. Candidates for City Council must be a resident of Dover for at least one year.

Voters will choose candidates for City Council, Mayor, School Board, as well as moderators, ward clerks, supervisors of the checklist and selectmen, from each ward.

Mechanic Street to close to traffic for two weeks beginning Aug. 26

Beginning the week of Aug. 26, 2019 and continuing for two weeks, Mechanic Street will be closed to through traffic from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. on weekdays. The closure is necessary while contractors at the development project at the corner of Chapel and Mechanic streets remove and replace curbing and sidewalk along Mechanic Street, and excavate in the roadway to access underground utility lines.

The School Street parking lot will be open and accessible from School Street and from the westerly side near Janetos Plaza. The rear parking lot of Janetos Plaza will be open and accessible from Chapel Street, but not from Mechanic Street. Mechanic Street will be open at night and on weekends.

The following events are recorded in "Notable Events in the History of Dover, New Hampshire: From the First Settlement in 1623 to 1865," by George Wadleigh, and several other historical sources.

For more on the history of Dover, settled in 1623 and the oldest permanent settlement in New Hampshire and seventh oldest in the country, visit the Dover Public Library, Locust Street; and the Woodman Museum, Central Avenue. The Public Library also maintains an online collection of historical information, located here.



Aug. 23, 1649 - The privilege at Bellamy Bank was granted to William Pomfrett, Thomas Layton and John Dam, for the erecting of a saw mill, and also 1,500 trees, oak and pine, to be "failed" in the swamp above the falls. Pomfrett and his partners also had liberty to fall timber in any place on the river out of other men's lots, paying the town 3d. for every tree.

Aug. 27, 1724 - The house of John Hanson, at Knox Marsh, was attacked by the Indians, two of his children killed, and his wife, maid servant and four children carried into captivity. Being a Friend he refused to leave his exposed position, as advised by his neighbors in the more compact part of the settlement. Thirteen Indians and French Mohawks lay for several days near his house in ambush waiting until Hanson and his men were away. When he had gone to the weekday meeting and two sons were at work at some distance the Indians entered the house. Mrs. Hanson with the servant and four children were in the house, of which one child the Indians immediately killed; two other children were at play in the orchard and would have escaped but that just as the Indians had finished rifling the house the two came in sight and made such noise that the Indians killed the youngest boy to stop the alarm. They then started for Canada, with Mrs. Hanson (who had been confined but two weeks previously,) her babe, a boy of six years, and two daughters of 14 and 16 years, and the servant girl. They all reached Canada and Mr. Hanson, soon after the attack, went there to ransom them. This he succeeded in doing, with the exception of his daughter of 16, whose ransom he was unable to obtain, as the Indians would not release her on any terms. Mr. Hanson got home Sept. 1, 1725, but he could not content himself while his daughter

was in bondage, and about the 19th April 1727 started in company with a kinsman who with his wife was bound on a similarly sad errand to redeem children; but he was taken sick and died on the journey. (An interesting account of Mrs. Hanson's capture and residence in Canada was published in 1780.)

Aug. 26, 1750 - A singular and splendid appearance in the heavens was noticed at this time which is thus described by one who witnessed it. "This evening I was suddenly surprised by an explosion in the air. It was a quarter after nine, and the sky as free from [clouds and thick of stars as I ever saw it. It appeared as if the sky opened in the south about half way from the horizon, as large as the broadside of a house, and the flame as deep a color as any fire I ever saw. It closed up gradually, and was near two minutes before it disappeared."

Aug. 26, 1833 - Died, widow Abigail Brown, aged 102 years, 4 months, 19 days. She was born in Madbury (then part of Dover) March 27, 1731. Her mother lived to the age of 102, and her grandmother to the age of 104.

Aug. 25, 1846 - A smart shock of an earthquake was felt in many places. To those within doors it sounded like a carriage driven violently over the ground, or the departure of a heavy train of railroad cars, for which it was at the time by many mistaken.

The Saturday morning walking tours begin at 10:30 a.m. Three different, 90-minute walking tours will be offered throughout the summer, and take place from one of three Dover locations as specified on the tour schedule.

The next tour is Aug. 24. The tour departs from the Woodman Museum and features information about construction, architectural techniques, and the historic significance of those who built or occupied these buildings, the earliest of which was constructed in 1785.

The City of Dover offers online access to City maps and property records through a web-based mapping platform. Explore neighborhoods and access local property data including:

- When is trash pickup at this address?
- What ward is this address and where do I vote?
- What zoning district am I in?
- What is the valuation of properties on this street?

To begin, find the area of interest by zooming in on the map or clicking on the "Search" button to search by address. Next, click on the "Themes" button to find select information such as wards and polling places, conservation and recreation lands or zoning maps.
