Dover's water quality reports available online

Water supply remains safe

Dover's Ireland Well, located within the Pudding Hill Aquifer, remains offline after the detection this week of perfluorinated compounds -- PFOA, PFOS and PFHpA -- that exceed the Environmental Protection Agency's most recent health advisory level of 70 parts per trillion (ppt). The well was voluntarily taken offline in June when levels of perfluorinated compounds increased to 48 ppt, still within established health advisory levels.

No water with values in excess of the EPA's advisory level of 70 ppt was supplied to customers.


In 2015, the city voluntarily closed the Griffin Well, also located within the Pudding Hill Aquifer. That decision was based on low levels of three perfluorinated chemicals (PFCs) detected at the site, adjacent to the former

Madbury Metals on Route 155. As is the case with the Ireland Well, the decision to close the Griffin Well was made out of an abundance of caution, despite the PFC levels being well below current Environmental Protection Agency guidelines. Also out of an abundance of caution, the city is limiting use of the new Dover Pudding Hill 1 (DPH1), which draws from the Pudding Hill Aquifer.

The city's remaining seven wells are routinely tested and remain a safe source of drinking water. None of these wells have tested positive for the same PFC compounds.

City Manager J. Michael Joyal, Jr. said the city is working with the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services and the city's aquifer consulting experts and water utility engineers to consider treatment options for expeditiously and safely returning the wells drawing from the Pudding Hill Aquifer back into production.

"In the meantime, with our recent system upgrades to the Lowell Avenue Treatment Plant and our other wells operating elsewhere throughout the city, it is important to note that we are able to maintain an adequate and safe supply of public drinking water," Joyal said. "Even so, with moderate drought conditions continuing throughout the region, we still encourage residents and businesses to be conscientious with their water usage."

Each year, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) requires community water systems to deliver a Consumer Confidence Report -- also known as an Annual Drinking Water Quality Report -- to their customers. These reports, which are mailed out to water customers by July 1, provide information about their drinking water quality including a summary of detected contaminants from the previous year, compliance, and educational information.

The City of Dover, along with the towns of Rollinsford, Lee and Madbury, will hold a Hazardous Waste Collection Day on Saturday, Aug. 25, 2018, from 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., at the City's Community Services facility, 271 Mast Road.

The goal of Hazardous Waste Collection Day is to allow for the proper disposal of household hazardous materials. Residents of the four communities can bring household

hazardous waste to Community Services for safe disposal.

The following household waste will be accepted: fertilizer with acids; bathroom cleaners; brush cleaner; pesticides car waxes/polish; disinfectants; corrosives; fungicides; creosote; furniture polish paint/stain/finish; insect spray; driveway sealers/tar; metal polish (lead and oil based); lighter fluid; flea powder; mothballs; rust preventative; pest strips/traps; gasoline; oven cleaner; solvents; pesticides; radiator flush; photo chemicals; thinner/turpentine; poisons; roofing tar; rug cleaner; wood preservatives; pool chemicals; and wood strippers.

Empty containers are not hazardous. Please dispose of them in your regular trash.

Explosives, asbestos, latex paint, oil (new or used) and antifreeze will not be accepted.

Proof of residency is required.

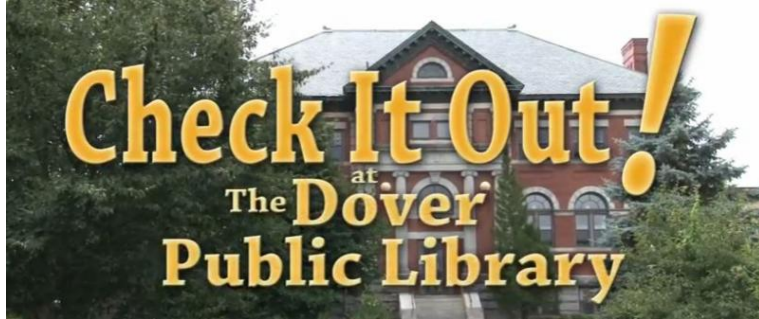

Celebrate Harry Potter's birthday at the Dover Public Library on July 28

Eternal glory awaits you at the Dover Public Library's third annual Harry Potter Day.

Join us and participate in the Triwizard Tournament on Saturday, July 28 from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. for an early celebration of Harry Potter's birthday. The event will end with a Harry Potter trivia competition at 12 p.m.

The following events are recorded in "Notable Events in the History of Dover, New Hampshire: From the First Settlement in 1623 to 1865," by George Wadleigh, "Historic Rambles About Dover," by Robert A. Whitehouse, "Port of Dover: Two Centuries of Shipping on the Cochecho" by Robert A. Whitehouse and Cathleen C. Beaudoin, and several other historical sources.

July 18, 1705 - Mr. Henry Longstar of Bloody Point deceased after 10 days sickness, occasioned by a fall into his leanto, four stairs high, whereby, being grievously bruised, it brought an inflammation upon him. He was about 100 years old - a hale, strong, hearty man. (Pike.)



July 22, 1765 - The vote passed at the annual meeting in March "to hire five schools for the space or term of six months," was reconsidered at a meeting called at the request of thirty free-holders by a constable, the selectmen having declined to do it. There were no organized school districts required by statute law until after 1800; hence, but few schoolhouses were erected and but few instructors were required.



July 23, 1822 - Drowned in the river, near the falls, Mr. Jedediah Hanson, aged 63. He had been reaping grain in a field near the river through the day, and went into the water to bathe. He was observed by those who had been at work with him to swim with "extraordinary lightness" some rods from the shore, when he very suddenly sunk. His body was recovered the next day.



July 25, 1857 - Died, Dr. Ezra Green, aged 101 years and 28 days. Dr. Green was born in Malden, Mass. June 17, 1746, O.S., graduated at Harvard College 1765, and settled in Dover as a physician in 1767. He served in the Army and Navy five years in the war of the Revolution, sailing with the celebrated Captain Paul Jones in the "Ranger," but ever afterwards lived in Dover, where he was held in great respect. For many years in early life, having given up the practice of his profession, he was the principal merchant or trader, going once or twice in the season to Boston to purchase his most valuable goods. He was the first Postmaster appointed for the town by President Washington, and held the office until he voluntarily resigned it during Mr. Jefferson's administration. He attended church regularly almost up to the last years of his life, was accustomed to vote in town meetings when he was nearly one hundred years old, and took a lively interest in public affairs as long as he lived.

July 24, 1892 - "An exciting and nearly fatal runaway accident took place on Central Street at noon today. One of the horses of C.H. Trickey & Co., attached to a heavy coal wagon took fright at a boy waving a flag and down Central Street, toward Central Square at a furious pace. When near the new Masonic block the team struck the electric car rails, throwing it violently to one side and hurling the driver Barney Daily to the ground, the wheels of the heavy wagon passing over him. He was taken up and conveyed to the Central Drug Store where it was found that severe injuries had been sustained. A cut about an inch long on the head was bleeding profusely and there were other scratches and bumps. The frightened animal kept on and when near Vickery's Drug Store, struck the carriage of T.W. Woodman, badly damaging it. The horse was stopped at Franklin Square. (Dover Enquirer)"

The July 21 tour begins at the Woodman Museum, located at 182 Central Ave. The architectural tour of historic buildings features information about construction, architectural techniques, and the historic significance of those who built or occupied these buildings, the earliest of which was constructed in 1785.
