

#### Traffic restrictions this weekend

There are several events in Dover this weekend that will affect traffic. They are as follows:

On **Saturday, June 2, from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m.,** Paintworks Unlimited and Hot Rod City will host an open house at 99 Oak St., the former National Guard Armory. This segment of Oak Street will be open to one-way traffic only from Portland toward Atlantic. Inbound traffic on Gulf Road will be diverted to Atlantic Avenue. This will allow overflow event parking along Oak Street, for which a block party permit was issued. Dover Police Department barricades will be used at Oak Street and Atlantic Avenue, and Oak Street and Fairview Drive, but police officers will not be on site.

On **Saturday**, **June 2**, **at 10:30** a.m., Arts In Reach (AIR) Walk, will hold a 3-mile walk that starts and ends at Henry

On **Sunday, Sunday, June 3, from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.**, the 75th annual NH Soap Box Derby will be held in Dover. From 8 a.m. until approximately 4 p.m., Broadway will be closed to all traffic between the intersections of Oak Street and Hill Street. All through traffic will be diverted via neighborhood streets, including Park and Hill streets. Oak Street will remain open. Effective at 6 a.m. on that date, on-street parking will be prohibited on Broadway between Oak and Hill streets. Residents and business owners with driveways on this section of Broadway, or on Rose Street, will not be able to access their driveways by car during this time period and must plan ahead to park on nearby side streets.

The New Hampshire Soap Box Derby is an annual event for boys and girls ages seven to 20 involving gravity-powered cars racing in side-by-side competition. Dover is the site of the 75th annual New Hampshire local championship. Top seeded racers in each region are eligible to compete in the All-American Soap Box Derby in Akron, Ohio. On **Sunday, June 3, at 9 a.m.,** Garrison Elementary School will hold its 2-mile Fun Run. There will be a brief closure of Garrison Road at Shaws Lane at 9 a.m. Most of the course is in the Riverdale and Morningside Drive neighborhood. A police cruiser will lead the race and an officer will be on hand for traffic control.

Temporary ramp closure on the Spaulding Turnpike in Dover

#### Northbound on-ramp at Exit 5 closed for one week

The New Hampshire Department of Transportation (NHDOT) has closed the ramp at Exit 5 on the Spaulding Turnpike (NH 16) in Dover to facilitate the reconstruction of the Spaulding Turnpike between the Little Bay Bridge and the Dover Toll Plaza.

The Spaulding Turnpike Exit 5 northbound on-ramp will be closed to vehicular traffic for roadway reconstruction across the existing ramp until Thursday, June 7, 2018 when the on-ramp will be re-opened to traffic.

Motorists seeking to access the Spaulding Turnpike northbound from Boston Harbor Road, Dover Point Road, and Wentworth Terrace will need to take the Exit 6 southbound on-ramp onto the Spaulding Turnpike southbound, continue south to Exit 4, and reverse direction via Shattuck Way and the Exit 6 northbound on-ramp.

This work is part of the Spaulding Turnpike improvement project in Newington and Dover. Severino Trucking Company, Inc. of Candia, New Hampshire is the prime contractor for the \$67 million project, which is scheduled to be completed in October 2020.

#### Portion of Sixth Street closed Wednesday afternoons for Farmer's Market beginning June 6

Beginning Wednesday, June 6, 2018, and continuing every Wednesday through Oct. 3, a segment of Sixth Street between Central Avenue and Chestnut Street (next to the Greater Dover Chamber of Commerce) will be closed from 2:15 to 6 p.m., for the Seacoast Growers Association's annual Farmers Market.

The market will be held at the closed portion of Sixth Street and in the Greater Dover Chamber of Commerce parking lot.

### Learn all about the Mount Washington Cog Railway

On Monday, June 4 at 6:30 p.m. Jonathan Hively will present a lecture about his time working for the Mount Washington Cog Railway. Hively worked for the railway as a fireman, brakeman and engineer from 1974-1986. He recently completed a book about his experience entitled "First Out: My Life on the Mt. Washington Cog Railway." Hively will bring a few items from his extensive collection of antiques and paraphernalia related to the Cog to share with the audience. Copies of his book will be available for purchase and signing at the event.

The first mountain climbing cog railway in the world will celebrate its 150th anniversary in 2019. The train makes a spectacular climb up a three-mile long trestle to the 6,288-foot summit of Mount Washington.

Hively lives in North Conway. He was born in Columbus, Ohio. Hively studied at Capital University in Bexley, Ohio in applied music and graduated from Thomas Edison College, Trenton, NJ with a Bachelor of Arts. He is also well known for his bagpipe playing.

The following events are recorded in "Notable Events in the History of Dover, New Hampshire: From the First Settlement in 1623 to 1865," by George Wadleigh, "Historic Rambles About Dover," by Robert A. Whitehouse, "Port of Dover: Two Centuries of Shipping on the Cochecho" by Robert A. Whitehouse and Cathleen C. Beaudoin, and several other historical sources.

For more on the history of Dover, settled in 1623 and the oldest permanent settlement in New Hampshire and seventh oldest in the country, visit the Dover Public Library, Locust Street; and the Woodman Institute Museum, Central Avenue. **June 4, 1706** - George Ricker and Maturin Ricker of Cochecho, were slain by the Indians. George was killed running up the lane near the garrison. Maturin was killed in his field, and his little son carried away.




**June 2, 1766** - The town voted to erect a dwelling house, stable, ferryways, etc. at Hilton's Point for the convenience of travellers and a committee was appointed to obtain subscriptions to defray the expense.



June 3, 1775 - A Committee of Safety was chosen by the town and it was voted that the recommendations of the Provincial Congress to the inhabitants of the colony be a general rule for the conduct of the committee and that the inhabitants of the town do strictly conform to the same. Thirty-one companies of soldiers were raised in New Hampshire at this time and marched to Medford, Mass. to reinforce Gen. Sullivan. The company raised in Dover constituted the 18th - John Waldron, Captain; Ebenezer

Ricker, 1st Lieut; John Goodwin, 2d Lieut.





**June 7, 1860** - Nathaniel Tuttle of Dover, who went down the river on a fishing excursion, was drowned by the upsetting of his boat near Portsmouth Light.
