Groundbreaking ceremony for Waterfront project is Tuesday, June 20

The city will host a groundbreaking ceremony at the city-owned waterfront site on River Street on Tuesday, June 20, at 5:30 p.m., and the public is invited to attend.

The ceremony marks the construction phase, decades in the making. The first part of the construction is public improvements, which form a significant part of this project, from constructing a new street system for site access to establishing necessary utilities for the upcoming buildings. A new 3.4-acre public riverfront park, shoreline stabilization, site grading to account for projected sea-level rise, and a new stormwater management system with green infrastructure are also part of the project.

The project also includes a private development component led by developer Cathartes, which is expected to begin next year once some of the public improvements are complete. The development plan includes three mixed-use buildings, two multifamily buildings, and three clusters of townhouses.

Approved by the Planning Board in June 2022, the development

Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday: 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. aims to revitalize the Dover waterfront and introduce approximately 26,000 square feet of commercial space and 418 residential units, comprising both rental and condominium units for sale.

The waterfront development project, which has been in the planning stages for years, took a significant step forward with the approval of the city's public improvements plan and Cathartes' site plan last year.

Construction of new Dover skatepark begins next week

Work on the new skatepark at Guppey Park is set to begin next week.

Recreation Director Gary Bannon updated the Recreation Advisory Board about the construction plans at its June 12 meeting. Bannon told the board that depending on the timing of construction, he was hopeful for a September dedication. The construction area will be fenced off until the project is complete.

Previous site work occurred at Guppey Park to prepare for the skatepark during the fall and spring; light poles were also installed.

In 2021, the City Council awarded the bid to construct the first phase of the skatepark to Artisan Skateparks of Kitty Hawk, North Carolina, for a cost not to exceed \$500,000. As envisioned, the skatepark would include three elements, the main skate park, a skate bowl, and a BMX pump track. The skate park will be built first, followed by the bowl and pump track in a future phase, as funding allows.

River Street skatepark halfpipe up for auction

Last week, the city posted for auction the halfpipe located at the current skatepark. The wooden vert ramp, sold as is, is approximately 75 feet long, five feet tall, and eight feet flat with one 10-foot wide extension that is eight feet tall with pool coping. It's framed with lumber in five-foot sections, surfaced with Skatelite.

Traffic restrictions, road clsoures in place Sunday for road race

On Sunday, June 18, 2023 at 9 a.m., the 13th annual Father's Day 5K Run/Walk event will be held at Margaritas on Members Way. This event is part of the Dover Race Series and benefits the Greater Seacoast Community Health network.

The following road closures and traffic restrictions will be in place:

- **Sixth Street** will be closed in the northerly direction at Indian Brook Drive between 9 and 9:15 a.m. to accommodate the early portion of the race.
- **Indian Brook Drive** will be closed in the westerly direction at Margaritas between 9 and 9:15 a.m. to accommodate the early portion of the race.
- Venture Drive will be closed to all traffic from 9 to 10 a.m.

Police officers will be on hand to help facilitate access to Homewood Suites and Northeast Credit Union off Members Way, but some delays should be expected.

Motorists should additionally expect lane shifts and brief delays on Indian Brook Drive and Sixth Street between 9 and 10 a.m. Parking for the event will be at the medical office park at 10 Members Way. Overflow parking may be available at the C&J Bus Terminal and Park and Ride, 23 Indian Brook Drive.

The course follows an out-and-back route utilizing Indian Brook Drive, Sixth Street, and Venture Drive.

Court Street sewer replacement to begin next month

Work will require daytime closure of Court Street and Middle Road

The emergency sewer replacement project on Court Street is slated to begin after the Fourth of July, which will necessitate the closure of Court Street and Middle Road in the project area.

The project will replace a failing sewer line of about 1,200 feet on Court Street and Middle Road between Tennyson Avenue and Hubbard Road. After a competitive bid process, the City Council awarded the construction contract to D&C Construction Co., of Weymouth, Massachusetts, for a cost not to exceed \$202,100.

The failing sewer line was discovered during the utility investigation in preparation for the Court Street Reconstruction Project, which is anticipated to go out to bid later this year. Because of the condition of the sewer line, city staff recommended its immediate replacement ahead of the full reconstruction project.

The contractor plans to mobilize to the project site beginning on Wednesday, July 5, with work starting on Monday, July 10. Work hours will be Monday through Friday, from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Work is anticipated to be completed by Sept. 1.

Traffic detour required

To allow the contractor to complete the work, the project area on Court Street and Middle Road will be closed to through traffic during work hours from Tennyson Avenue to Hubbard Road for the project's duration. Road closures will be posted within the project area depending on where the excavation occurs, and only residents within the closed zone will be allowed access. All through traffic should follow marked detour routes or should seek alternate routes.



Boat race part of festivities in celebration of Dover's 400th anniversary

The Great Bay Yacht Club, in collaboration with Dover 400, is pleased to announce the upcoming boat race event as part of the Dover on the Water festivities. This event will take place on Saturday, June 24, 2023, at Great Bay Yacht Club and Hilton State Park.

"Dover by The Water" is an event dedicated to honoring the 50 miles of water surrounding Dover while celebrating the remarkable 400-year history of this vibrant city. As a key highlight of the festivities, the boat race will showcase the spirit of sailing and bring together participants of all ages and skill levels.

The race will adhere to the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) 2021-2024, as well as the Notice of Race (NOR) and Sailing Instructions (SI) provided at the Skippers' Meeting. While Merry Macs will be featured, the event welcomes other small sailing boats and dinghies, such as Oyster River Cats, Handy Cats, and Nutshell Prams. In the event of sufficient participation, additional starts and courses may be employed to accommodate all boats.

Participants of all ages are eligible to compete in the boat race, and the entry fee is \$40. The schedule for the day includes registration at 2 p.m. at Hilton Park, followed by the Skippers' Meeting at 3 p.m. The first warning signal is scheduled for 4 p.m., with subsequent races to follow. No starts will occur after approximately 6 p.m., around high tide at 6:09 p.m. at Dover Point. After the races, an awards ceremony, barbecue, storytelling, and other enjoyable activities will take place at the Great Bay Yacht Club.

To ensure a smooth experience, participants must register before the Skippers' Meeting. Sailing Instructions will be available at the meeting. Scoring will be conducted using Low Point Scoring as per RRS Appendix A, allowing for one discard if four races are completed.

The racing area will span from the Hilton Park ramp, where participants will launch, sailing upstream to the designated area. Courses will include windward-leeward and triangle configurations, utilizing inflatable marks.

The boat race will culminate with awards presented to the first- through fifth-place finishers, with recognition given to other boat classes in attendance. For more information or inquiries, please text Tom Brown at 603-978-4765.


June 23, 1825 — The long-expected visit of the Nation's guest, General Lafayette, was made to Dover at this time. Having come from Concord, where he had been received by the Legislature, he was met near the Durham line by the Dover committee of arrangements and a large number of citizens in carriages and on horseback, among whom were about 30 young gentlemen, from 15 to 20 years of age, in uniform dress, and mounted, who added much interest to the scene.

June 18, 1833 — A public meeting was held to make arrangements for the reception of President Jackson, then on a visit to Concord, who was expected to pass through town on his way to Portland. But the President, in consequence of feeble health, returned directly to Boston and Washington.

June 24, 1853 — Miss Elisabeth Coffin died this day at age 68. She was a lineal descendant of Peter Coffin and the last to retain the family name in Dover. She lived and died on lands originally owned by her ancestor and which had remained in the family for 200 years.

June 19, 1958 — Wesley Powell, then the president of the Dover Industrial Corp., announced on this day that Tiara Footwear Inc. had leased the top floor of the vacant Pacific Mills building and would begin manufacturing operations in Dover. The company expected to employ more than 400 people once production was underway.

June 18, 1999 — The Greater Dover Chamber of Commerce on this day announced the lineup for the 13th annual Cochecho Arts Festival. Performers announced for the Children's Series included magician BJ Hickman. Hickman, the only performer who has appeared every year since the festival began in 1987, will appear again at this year's 37th annual Cochecho Arts Festival.
