

Storm track still uncertain; stay up to date on parking bans with alerts

Winter is still here. The National Weather Service has issued a Hazardous Weather Outlook for Dover. According to the most recent reports, plowable snow of up to 4 inches may fall in Dover Saturday afternoon and evening. Another, stronger storm may bring much more snow Sunday evening, into Monday morning. However, that storm track remains uncertain as of Friday, according to the National Weather Service.



The New Hampshire Department of Transportation (NHDOT) will hold a public listening session in Dover on Monday, March 18, 2019 to discuss proposed improvements to New Hampshire Route 108 in Dover, Somersworth, and Rochester. The public is invited and encouraged to attend to provide input on potential improvements.

The March 18 public listening session will be held in the Renaissance Room at the Dover Middle School, 16 Daley Drive in Dover, beginning at 7 p.m. and ending at 9 p.m. A short presentation will be followed by open discussion of ideas and dialogue between the public and the NHDOT project team.

This project involves the study of improvements to NH Route 108 from the intersection of NH Route 9/Indian Brook Drive in Dover to Innovation Drive in Rochester, a distance of approximately five miles. The objective of the project is to develop a design alternative that will improve the safety and mobility of all users by applying 'Complete Street' principles, with the central goal of achieving an appropriate balance between the needs of motorized, non-motorized, and transit users of the corridor.

Interested property owners, public officials, employers and roadway users are welcome and will be given the opportunity to provide input on the project.

Any individuals needing assistance or auxiliary communication equipment due to sensory impairment or other disability should contact the Bureau of Right-of-Way, NHDOT, PO Box 483, Concord, NH 03302-0483 or call 603-271-3222. TDD access: Relay NH 1-800-735-2964. Notification of the need for assistance must be made at the earliest convenience.

Historic properties may be impacted by the project. Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act offers those that possess a direct interest in historical resources, including town officials, Historical Societies, and Historical Commissions, an opportunity to become more involved in an advisory role during project development as "Consulting Parties." Those interested should contact the NHDOT.

Dover Chamber accepting scholarship applications, educator of year nominations





This week in DOVER HISTORY



The following events are recorded in "Notable Events in the History of Dover, New Hampshire: From the First Settlement in 1623 to 1865," by George Wadleigh, and several other historical sources.

For more on the history of Dover, settled in 1623 and the oldest permanent settlement in New Hampshire and seventh oldest in the country, visit the Dover Public Library, Locust Street; and the Woodman Museum, Central Avenue. March 4, 1834 - Mills of Cocheco Manufacturing Co. stopped for three days in consequence of a turn out of the female operatives, occasioned by a reduction of their pay.



March 3, 1842 - Dennis Halleran, aged 50, was killed by the caving of the earth, while at work in an excavation on the railroad near the village.




March 1, 1858 - A public meeting in the Town Hall, at which the war with Mexico, the Texas question, and other matters were discussed by General Sam Houston and Horace Greeley.



March 2, 1860 - Abraham Lincoln of Illinois addresses the Republicans of Dover on the politics of the day.



March 4, 1865 - The bells were again rung and a National salute fired in honor of the inauguration of President Lincoln for his second term, and of the glorious victories of the armies of the Union "marching on" through the Carolinas.

Tree clearing continues at sites of upcoming water supply work

Crews preparing for major water infrastructure projects this spring are clearing trees and brush at the site of Dover's Smith and Cummings well on the city's north end, and at Willand Pond.

This initial work is to prepare the sites for water facilities improvements and construction in Dover and Somersworth this spring. That work includes well improvements and the construction of a 5,500-foot transmission main on New Rochester Road (Route 108). The transmission main will connect newly constructed wells on the city's north end with the Lowell Avenue Water Treatment Facility.

In addition, a new water main will be constructed on the north side of Willand Pond and connect the water supply between Dover and Somersworth, in case of an emergency. The city councils in Dover and Somersworth approved the work earlier this year.

These improvements will add about 850,000 gallons of water capacity in Dover each day.


Construction will begin this spring and continue through December 2019. While construction is under way, access to Willand Pond from New Rochester Road in Dover will be restricted. Recreational access to Willand Pond will remain open from High Street in Somersworth.

The nearly \$12 million project is being funded by a \$9.1 million low-interest loan from the Drinking Water State Revolving Loan Fund, which allows 10 percent of the debt to be forgiven, and a \$2.6 million grant from the New Hampshire Drinking Water and Groundwater Trust Fund.

The project engineer is Underwood Engineers of Portsmouth.
