Through a grant from Telsa, Inc., the City received four wallmount units at no cost, as well as \$4,000 towards installation. The Electric Vehicle Charging (EVC) wall units are on the second floor in the northeast corner of the garage, just above the interior entrance to the Police Station. Two wall units are dedicated Tesla units and two are universal stations available to any non-Tesla plug-in electric vehicle. The four units will be shared among three parking spaces to allow for several combinations for universal and Tesla vehicles.

"The electric vehicle market is growing and it was important for the city to promote alternative energy driving options for our downtown employees and visitors," Reynolds said.

The spaces are paid for by drivers through the regular Pay by Space meter system used throughout the parking garage. There is a four-hour limit on these spaces. Permit holders with plug-in electric vehicles may use these spaces but must adhere to the time limit and move to other spaces once the four-hour period has elapsed.

Road closures in place Sunday for road race

Dover Police Chief Anthony F. Colarusso, Jr. announces the following road closures for the 10th annual Moms on the Run Mother's Day 5K event, which is part of the Dover Race Series.

On Sunday, May 13, 2018 at 9 a.m., the following road closures will be in effect:

- Exit 7 southbound off-ramp from the Spaulding Turnpike, 9 to 9:30 a.m.
- Bellamy Road, in the easterly direction between Durham Road and Alumni Drive, 9:05 to 10 a.m.
- Rutland Street, between Cataract Avenue and Central Avenue, 9 to 9:20 a.m.
- Cataract Avenue, 9 to 9:15 a.m.

Motorists should expect delays at the Central Avenue/Mill Street/Exit 7S intersection, and a lane shift along Route 108 between Rutland Street and Bellamy Road. Dover police personnel, New Hampshire State Police, and a number of event volunteers will be on hand to help manage the flow of traffic along the race route. The start and finish point for this event is Dover High School, 25 Alumni Drive.

Red Flag warning in effect today

Due to a National Weather Service classification of a "Red Flag" day, there will be no burning allowed in the City of Dover today, Friday, May 11, 2018.

This applies to all permit categories.

The warning, issued by the National Weather Service and Dover Fire and Rescue, will remain in effect until 8 p.m. this evening.

Very dry conditions today will combine with gusty northwest winds to produce dangerous conditions for wildfires. If a fire develops, it could spread rapidly in these conditions. Use extra precaution to avoid starting a fire.

The following events are recorded in "Notable Events in the History of Dover, New Hampshire: From the First Settlement in 1623 to 1865," by George Wadleigh, "Historic Rambles About Dover," by Robert A. Whitehouse, "Port of Dover: Two Centuries of Shipping on the Cochecho" by Robert A. Whitehouse and Cathleen C. Beaudoin, and several other historical sources.

May 12, 1675 - In answer to the petition of the inhabitants of Oyster River - Philip Hollet, Jno. Bickford, Robert Burnhams, John Woodman and others, the General Court ordered, "that the petitioners shall have liberty yearly to choose three selectmen, who shall have power to make such rate or rates as they shall see the necessity for the maintenance of the ministry, to be collected by the constables according to law."



May 13, 1729 - The petitioners seeking to set off the northeastern part of Dover as a parish (Somersworth) appeared before the Assembly and were heard by their counsel, resulting in the appointment of a committee "to go on the spot and view the several districts and settle a dividing line according to their best judgments and that the petitioners in the meantime be free from being rated to the minister of the old town, &c. and the major part agreeing shall be accounted sufficient to make return at the next session for confirmation."

May 15, 1732 - The Assembly voted that Oyster River in Dover be a Parish by the name of Durham, and the act was approved by Gov. Belcher on this day.

May 14, 1849 - Died, Eunice Varney, aged 99 years, 5 months, 21 days - a member of the Society of Friends and the oldest person in town.

May 17, 1805 - The Dover Turnpike road from Dover to South Berwick was opened this year. In the Sun, of this date, John Wheeler, Treasurer, gives notice to stockholders that the Directors have ordered the fourth assessment to be paid, and Stephen Sawyer advertises for "30 or 40 stout able bodied young men" to work on the road.
