The Dover Police Department announces an arrest in the recent vandalism that occurred in the City's parking garage. Dover Police Department Special Investigation's Bureau detectives and Crime Scene Unit officers began an investigation after a vandalism spree left damage to the garage that included a broken window in the elevator vestibule, as well as damage to the building's fire alarm system.

Surveillance camera footage was able to determine the vandalism occurred at approximately 3:30 AM on July 27, 2017. The surveillance cameras also captured images of a suspect. These images were circulated in the media and by investigating detectives. These photos led to the identification of Christopher McPhee, 22, of 67 Oak Street, Dover.

McPhee turned himself in at Dover Police headquarters without incident at approximately 1:15 PM on July 28, 2017. He was charged with one count of felony level criminal mischief.

McPhee was released on \$5000.00 personal recognizance bail and is scheduled to appear for arraignment in Strafford County Superior Court on August 10, 2017.
