## DOVER POLICE ANNOUNCES SECOND ARREST IN BURGLARY INVESTIGATION

## February 10, 2021

**Dover, NH**, February 10, 2021 - Chief William Breault of the Dover Police Department announces that an additional arrest has been made as a result of a recent residential burglary in Dover.

On January 29, 2021, at approximately 0900 hours, officers spoke with residents of a Sandy Lane home who reported hearing a suspicious noise and found footprints outside their home. Officers also spoke with a neighbor who reported seeing a suspicious vehicle pull into several driveways in the neighborhood early that same morning.

On January 30, 2021, officers began investigating a burglary at a separate home on Sandy Lane. Members of the department's Special Investigations Unit and Crime Scene Unit responded to process and investigate the scene.

On January 31, 2021, at approximately 8:30PM, a police officer on patrol in the area of these incidents observed a vehicle matching the description of the one seen on Sandy Lane. The officer stopped the vehicle and identified the operator as Michael J. Skidmore, 33, of 10 Folsom Street Apt. 3 in Dover. As reported in the prior media release, Skidmore was charged with one count of Burglary.

As the investigation continued, detectives identified a second suspect involved in the Sandy Lane burglary as Dominic J. Archambault, 28, of 23 Elm Street Apt. 5, Milton, NH. On Tuesday, February 9, 2021, with assistance from the Somersworth Police Department, Dover detectives located and arrested Archambault at his workplace in Somersworth.

Archambault was charged with one count of Burglary, a felony. Archambault refused bail and will be arraigned in Strafford Superior Court on February 10, 2021 at 12:00 PM.

This entire incident remains under investigation and additional charges are possible.
