

Please read this entire packet for all of our new safety practices. We appreciate your cooperation during this time.

During Phase 3, we will be following the new **Hockey and Indoor Ice Arena Guidelines** set forth by the State of New Hampshire. Which can be found at nh.gov under the safer at home tab.

Athletes (youth and adult), volunteers/coaches, and referees for all on ice activities must have a negative test by November 6th in order to be on the ice. The test must have been taken between October 15th and November 6th. The test can be either PCR or Rapid. The test results must be provided to the hockey program that you are associated with. If you are skating in an arena (recreation) based program please call 603-516-6060 on where to show results. If any participant does not have a negative result by November 6th they will not be allowed on the ice.

Athletes, coaches, and volunteers will be screened upon arrival at the ice arena by having their temperature taken and being asked the COVID-19 related questions. If any athlete/volunteer has a fever of 100.4 or higher or has answered yes to any of the COVID-19 related questions, they will not be allowed to enter the facility. Spectators will be asked the COVID-19 questions, they will not be required to have temperatures taken. If the spectators answer yes to any of COVID-19 related questions, they will not be allowed to enter the facility.

Gators/masks are now required to be worn on the benches by all skaters (youth and adult). The gator/mask can be pulled down when playing on the ice.

No team or group will be allowed in the rink until 15 minutes before their event. Each team/group is required to exit the locker room and the facility within 15 minutes of the end of their event.

New Rink Rules:

- Proof of a negative COVID-19 test between the dates of October 15, 2020 and November 6, 2020 is required for all on ice activities to be allowed on the ice on November 6th and after that date.
- All athletes, coaches/volunteers will be screened upon arrival with their temperatures taken.
- Spectators will be screened upon arrival and asked if they can answer no to all of the COVID-19 related questions.
- Gators/masks are required to be worn on the benches at all times by all athletes.
- Each member of the family must stay together and remain 6ft away from other families.
- Children that are in the facility as spectators must remain with their family at all times, or the family will be asked to leave.
- Players, coaches/volunteers can enter 15 minutes before their event.
- Players, coaches/volunteers must exit the locker room and facility 15 minutes after their event.
- Facemasks are required at all times in the facility (unless on the ice).
- Main hallway will remain one way only.

Traffic Flow Pattern:

- Everyone must enter in the front doors.
- Spectators must go right and enter into the Holt rink to spectate the game/practice. When exiting facility, please exit out of the side doors near the bathroom or side doors near the bleachers.
- Players must go down the hallway (one way only) to get to their locker room. When done on the ice, players will exit out of the side doors near the DHS locker room in the rear of the building.
- No one is to exit out of the front doors.
