



Fire & Rescue Run Profile by Major Incident Type (CY 2023)




Fire and Rescue – Call Volume




Simultaneous Call Growth-Rate




10 Year Projection of Mutual Aid Ambulance Requests and Mutual Aid Ambulance Transports






10 Year Projection of Annual Loss from Mutual Aid Ambulance Transports.







U.S. Fire Department Run Profile by Major Incident Type








2023 Calls For Service

 CRR is the process of identifying and prioritizing local risks, followed by the integrated and strategic investment of resources to reduce their occurrence and impact.

 In other words, CRR is the process of helping communities find out what risks they face and develop a plan to help mitigate the risks viewed as high priority.




