City Council to hear updates on parking, Library renovations

The City Council will hold a workshop on Wednesday, Aug. 7, 2024, at 7 p.m. in Council Chambers to discuss the city's parking system and the upcoming renovation of the Dover Public Library.

The first presentation of the evening will provide an update on Dover's parking system. Charles Reynolds, Chair of the Parking Commission, Bill Simons, Parking Manager, and Christopher Parker, Deputy City Manager, will cover the evolution of Dover's parking management, current parking inventory, and future plans for the system. The presentation will also provide a comprehensive overview of the city's parking strategies and potential upcoming changes.

Following the parking update, Dover Public Library Director Denise LaFrance will provide an update on the library's upcoming renovation project. The renovation, slated to begin in 2025, will be the first major update to the building since 1988. LaFrance is expected to discuss the need for modernization, plans to improve accessibility and potential changes to the library's layout and services.

The renovation project was recently featured on an episode of the Dover Download podcast, where LaFrance discussed the planned changes and the temporary relocation of library services during the construction period. The episode can be [accessed here](#) or on most podcast platforms.

Dover Main Street will host two nights of outdoor movies as part of the Greater Dover Chamber of Commerce Cochecho Arts Festival.

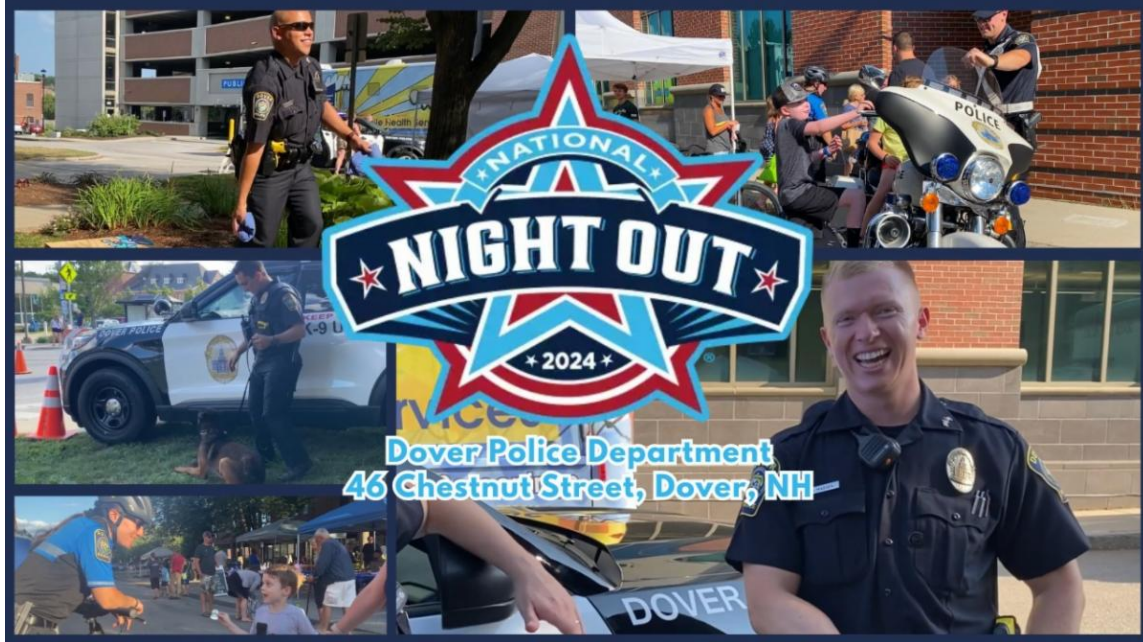

Dover Police to host National Night Out

The Dover Police Department will host its annual National Night Out event on Tuesday, Aug. 6.

National Night Out will be held at the police station at 46 Chestnut St. from 4 to 7 p.m. and is free to the public. It is a time for community members to meet with police officers, discuss issues, learn what police do, and unite with the common goal of crime prevention and safety.

The public will be able to take tours of the station and see various displays around the building, including some of the specialized equipment and vehicles. These will include a police cruiser, a police motorcycle, a crime scene vehicle, and a tactical rescue vehicle. Several officers, including the K9 (police dog) officer, will be at the event and interact with the public.

Other city departments and community organizations will provide information on health, safety, and wellness. Information on drug prevention, treatment and recovery resources, violence prevention, and local mental health resources will also be available. The Loyal Order of Moose Lodge 443 will be outside the station cooking burgers and hot dogs, which will be free to attendees.

Dover's National Night Out is a family-oriented event affiliated with National Night Out, which, according to organizers, involves over 35 million people in more than 10,000 communities across the nation.



Washington Street paving

begins Sunday night

Weather permitting, a city contractor will pave Washington Street from Chestnut Street to Whittier Street starting Sunday, Aug. 4. The work is scheduled nightly from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. through the week.

On-street parking will be prohibited from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m. during the project. Violators will be towed.

Motorists should expect road closures and detours. Flaggers will be on site to direct traffic. Local traffic and emergency vehicles will be allowed through the work zone.

The road will be milled full width and castings adjusted before paving. Drivers should be cautious of raised structures until paving is complete.

Section of Mast Road to close temporarily on Tuesday, Aug. 6

Ongoing traffic restrictions in place as construction continues

A section of Mast Road will be closed to all traffic on Tuesday, Aug. 6, from 3:30 to 8 p.m. This closure is necessary for Eversource to remove a utility pole in front of the new Inspection Services building currently under construction at 271 Mast Road.

During this closure, all traffic on the affected section of Mast Road will be detoured. Motorists are advised to seek alternate routes and plan for additional travel time.

The city also reminds residents and commuters of ongoing traffic restrictions in place for the next several weeks as construction continues:

- A section of Mast Road near 271 Mast Road, between the two driveways of the Pierre B. Bouchard Public Works Facility, remains reduced to a single lane with alternating two-way traffic
- Access to the Public Works facility and adjacent Recycling Center at 265 Mast Road is being maintained, though brief delays may occur

Motorists are urged to exercise caution in the construction area, obey all posted signs, and be prepared for changing traffic patterns.

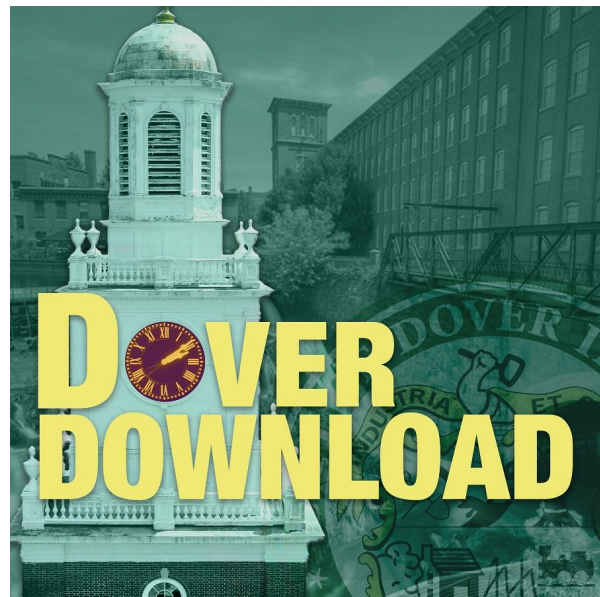

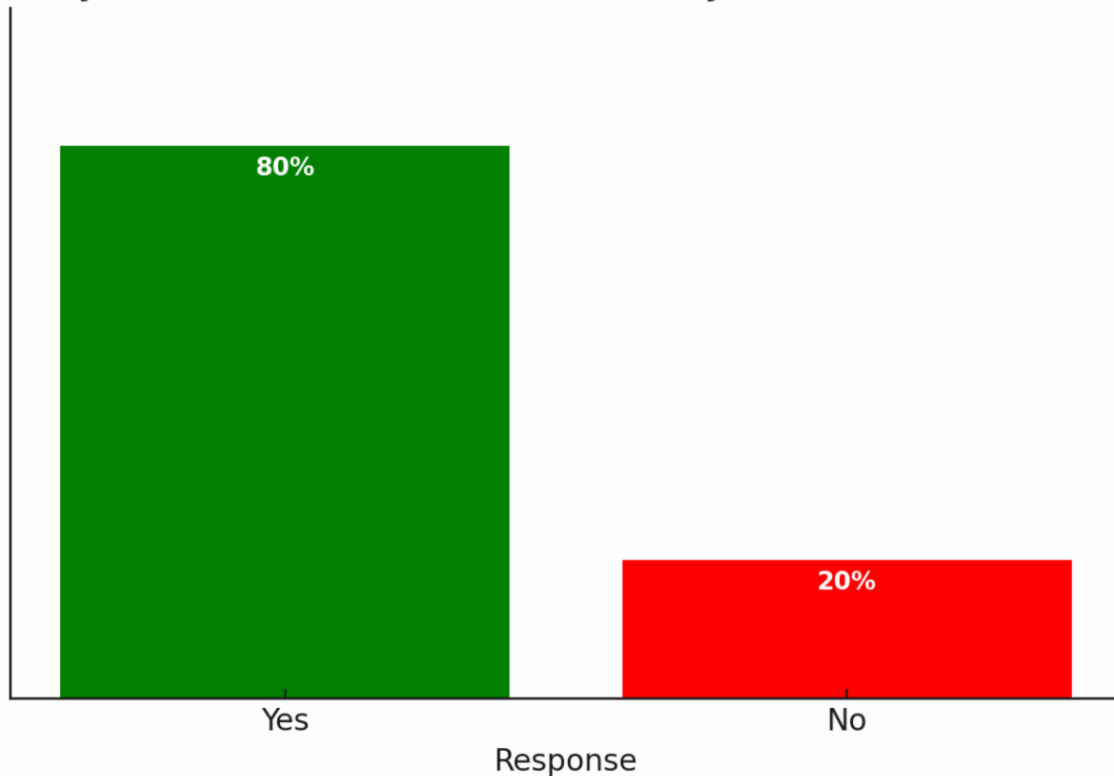

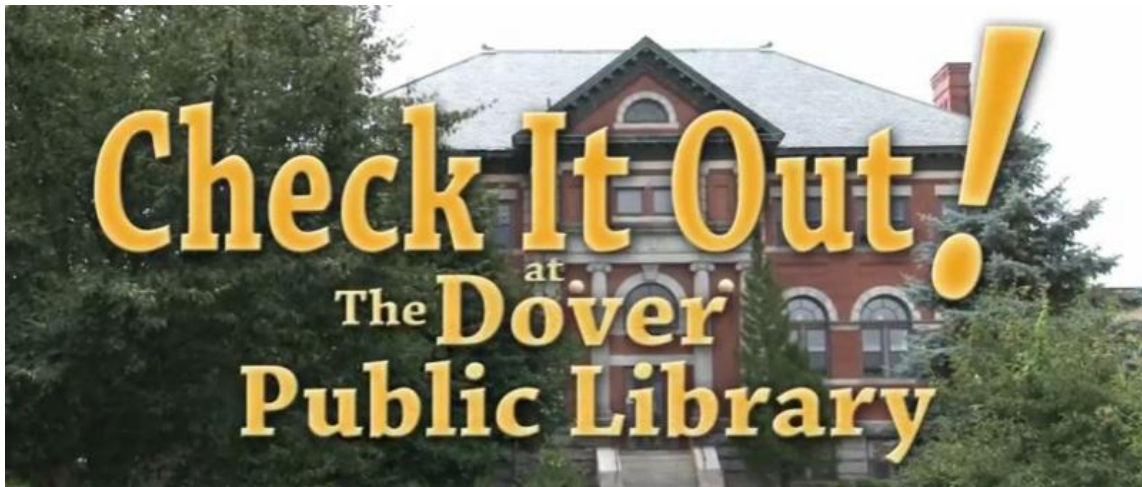
Aug. 7, 1661 — Dover and Portsmouth were criticized for lacking a sufficient bridge for horse and foot over the Cochecho River. The Court ordered a committee be formed from the two towns to study the issue and determine whether a new bridge was needed.

Aug. 2, 1855 — A horse mackerel weighing over 1,400 pounds was caught by Dover fishermen near the Isles of Shoals and exhibited in town. (Dover Enquirer)

Aug. 3, 1896 — Foster's Daily Democrat reported on this day that, "Alonzo Whitehouse and his wife went to Lynn today on a two-week vacation. Mr. Whitehouse is still an admirer of the top hat and deplores the fact that Dover has given up the custom."

Aug. 3, 1933 — The third City Hall burned. The City Hall and Opera house was dedicated Dec. 16, 1891 and cost \$250,000 to build. It featured a floor that could rise and fall, a chandelier with 95 electric bulbs, three tiers of boxes with brass rails, velvet curtains with gold fringe, a frescoed ceiling and a cupid mural. The Opera House had a seating capacity of 1,800 and was the largest stage in New Hampshire. Luminaries such as Jason Robards, Alfred Lunt, Shirley Booth and John Philip Sousa's band graced the stage. The first full-length movie shown here was "Birth of a Nation" starring Lillian Gish.

Aug. 3, 1998 — The Garrison Players, a community theater group formed in Dover, held a Victorian garden party fundraiser in 1998 to support the restoration of their new home, what was then called the Community Arts Center. Hosted by Ray and Helen Jobin at their Dover Point Road home, the event featured garden tours, artists at work, and attendees in Victorian attire. The group aimed to raise \$1,500 to \$2,000 towards their \$350,000 goal for renovating the building. The fundraiser was part of a 12-year effort to establish a permanent venue for performances and to support other local artists. Today, the Garrison Players Arts Center continues to operate, offering a variety of productions and community programs from its location in Rollinsford.

City of Dover, surrounding towns, to hold Household Hazardous Waste Day Aug. 24

The City of Dover, along with the towns of Rollinsford, Lee and Madbury, will hold a Hazardous Waste Collection Day on Saturday, Aug. 24, 2024, from 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., at the City's Community Services facility, 271 Mast Road.

The goal of Hazardous Waste Collection Day is to allow for the proper disposal of household hazardous materials. Residents of the four communities can bring household hazardous waste to Community Services for safe disposal.

The following household waste will be accepted: fertilizer with acids; bathroom cleaners; brush cleaner; pesticides; car waxes/polish; disinfectants; corrosives; fungicides; creosote; furniture polish paint/stain/finish; insect spray; driveway sealers/tar; metal polish (lead and oil-based); lighter fluid; flea powder; mothballs; rust preventatives; pest strips/traps; gasoline; oven cleaners; solvents; pesticides; radiator flush; photo chemicals; thinner/turpentine; poisons; roofing tar; rug cleaner; wood preservatives; pool chemicals; and wood strippers. Empty containers are not hazardous. Please dispose of them in your regular trash.

Explosives, asbestos, batteries, fluorescent bulbs, propane tanks, latex paint, waste oil and antifreeze will not be accepted.

Hazardous Waste Collection Day is for residents only. Proof of residency is required.

Community Action Partnership of Strafford County (CAPSC) is now accepting priority applications for the 2024-2025 Federal Fuel Assistance Program.

Priority applicants include those 60 and older, individuals with documented disabilities, households with children under 6, and those using wood as their primary heating source.

Approval is subject to income eligibility requirements, with rent ranging from \$1,086 to \$1,409 per month.

Amalura Health is a nurse practitioner-owned direct primary care (DPC) practice operated by founder Lauren McMullen, MSN, APRN, NP-C. What separates the DPC model from

the traditional healthcare model is that it removes insurance from the Provider/Patient relationship; therefore, the provider isn't beholden to all of the insurance demands and rules. This allows the provider to spend the extra time focusing on the patient and allows the patient better access to their provider.

What sets direct primary care apart from the traditional healthcare model is that patients pay their PCP directly for comprehensive services via a monthly or annual membership. Unlike the similar concierge medicine model, insurance is not necessary for those who opt for DPC. The provider does not bill the patient's insurance, and therefore is not required to spend hours on tedious coding and billing. Instead, the PCP spends that time caring directly for their patients, cultivating strong provider-patient relationships. Even though DPC providers do not bill the patients' insurance, patients are still able to use their insurance plans to pay for things like labs, imaging, and medication. Additionally, direct primary care provides a much smaller panel of patients than traditional primary care provider, which afford patients a higher quality patient-provider relationship and ability to focus on their specific healthcare needs.
