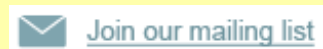
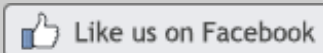

## Dover Police Department announces Virtual Neighborhood Watch

Chief William Breault of the Dover Police Department is pleased to announce a new program that will help strengthen the partnership between the police and the public while helping officers investigate cases more efficiently.

The new program is called "Virtual Neighborhood Watch" and it is intended to help solve crimes and keep our community safe. Due to advances in technology, security cameras are less expensive, easy to install, and more prevalent than before. Many businesses and homeowners have security cameras, which means those cameras could inadvertently be a witness to a crime nearby. Virtual Neighborhood Watch (VNW) allows residents and business owners who have surveillance cameras to register their addresses or businesses with the Dover Police Department.

The Dover Police Department is not asking for live access to camera systems. The Dover Police Department will not monitor the security cameras. We will only contact registered participants if a crime occurs in or around their neighborhood to see if the cameras captured what took place. By getting this information to the police as soon as possible, it will help the investigating officers solve crimes faster and more

efficiently.

Once participants register their camera with the Dover Police Department, they will only be notified if a crime or incident occurs in or around their neighborhood. The participants will be asked to check their footage for any activity. A camera mounted on a garage or home could make a critical difference in an officers' ability to identify a suspect or solve a case.

This is a completely voluntary program and participants can opt out at any time.

## This week in DOVER HISTORY

The following events are recorded in "Notable Events in the History of Dover, New Hampshire: From the First Settlement in 1623 to 1865," by George Wadleigh, and several other historical sources.

For more on the history of Dover, settled in 1623 and the oldest permanent settlement in New Hampshire and seventh oldest in the country, visit the Dover Public Library, Locust Street; and the Woodman Museum, Central Avenue. **July 6, 1690** - Two companies under the Captains Floyd and Wiswall, who were scouting, discovered an Indian track, which they pursued till they came up with the enemy at Wheelwright's Pond, in Lee (then a part of Dover), where a bloody engagement ensued for some hours; in which Wiswall, his lieutenant, Flagg, and Sergeant Walker, with twelve more, were killed, and several wounded. It was not known how many of the enemy fell, as they always carried off their dead. Floyd maintained the fight after Wiswall's death, till his men, fatigued and wounded, drew off; which obliged him to follow. The enemy retreated at the same time; for when Captain Convers went to look after the wounded, he found seven alive, whom he brought in by sunrise the next morning, and then returned to bury the dead.



**July 8, 1707** - John Bunker and Ichabod Rawlins, both of Dover, going with a cart from Lt. Zachariah Field's garrison to James Bunker's for a loom, were assaulted by many Indians, and both slain. The enemy, supposed to be 20 or 30 in number, slaughtered many cattle for the Jones's at the same time, to the number of 15 or more.



**July 5, 1792** - "We are informed from good authority that a canal is to be dug from Winnepesaukee pond to unite the waters with the Cochecho river - and that a subscription is filling for that purpose - and we hear that a gentleman of property in Portsmouth has offered 500 pounds towards the undertaking - and considering the rage for Canal cutting - it will be accomplished with ease - as 'tis said, that the water in the pond at the time of the great freshet, a few years since, overflowed, and found their way into Cochecho river." A correspondent of the Phoenix, in the issue of July 19, offers to "communicate" the waters of the pond and the Cochecho for one hundred dollars, though he says "to make it navigable for rafts of lumber, etc., from Merrymeeting river to Norway Plain in Rochester, it will undoubtedly cost several



thousands."



**July 9, 1860** - Died, Captain Moses Paul, aged 63. He was Agent of the Cocheco Manufacturing Co. for nearly 30 years, and had been connected with the manufacturing business from its first introduction into the place. During this long period, the affairs of the Company were conducted by him with an energy and success which secured the approbation of its stockholders, while the care and attention which he ever bestowed upon the many thousands in its employ won for him their respect and esteem. Few manufacturing establishments in the country have been managed with more success, and in none has a better feeling more uniformly prevailed between the employers and the employed. Liberal and public spirited as a citizen - ever ready with his counsel and his means to advance the welfare of the community - the city of Dover owes much of its prosperity and many of its public improvements to his open hand and generous heart. Few men have enjoyed more deservedly a larger measure of the respect of their fellow citizens, and the death of none will be more deeply and generally regretted. (Dover Enquirer)

The Greater Dover Chamber of Commerce is again hosting walking tours of historic Dover through Labor Day weekend.

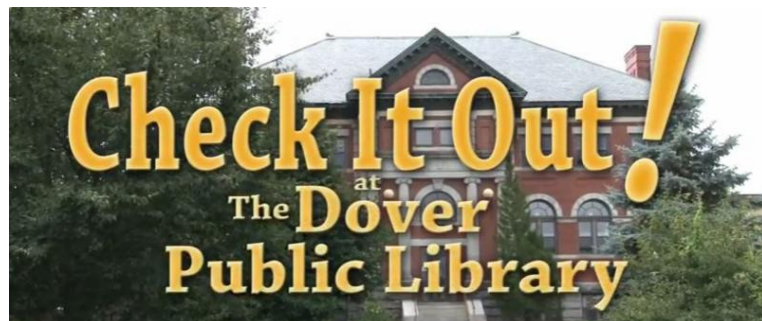

Newman is a full-time musician and full-time baseball fan who has been to 91 major and minor league parks. He was a sportswriter for 18 years, working for the Boston Globe, Associated Press, Patriot Ledger, Lowell Sun and other suburban Massachusetts newspapers.

He has combined his love of baseball with music, having recorded two CDs of baseball music, "Baseball's Greatest Hits, Volumes 1 & 2". Both albums have been accepted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, New York. His musical compositions include songs about Johnny Damon, Mario Mendoza, Doug Mientkiewicz, Tug McGraw, and Bob Heise.

During the show, Howie will sing baseball songs, offer up baseball trivia, and talk about his days on the Bosox beat. "Baseball is the one sport that really lends itself to music," said Newman, whose experience also includes three years of radio color commentary for the Lowell Spinners, a Red Sox farm team. "If people have questions about the Red Sox and what it's like to cover the team, I'll be happy to answer them. It's going to be a very unique show and I'm sure folks will enjoy it. I'll also be playing some old songs from the 1920s through 1970, so there will be something for everyone."
