Coming up at the next City Council meeting

Council to consider warming center funds

Community Services facility expansion, election hours also on agenda

The City Council will consider a resolution at its Wednesday, Sept. 27 meeting that would authorize the City Manager to enter into an agreement with Somersworth, Rochester, and Strafford County to operate the Warming Center. It would also allow the city to expend up to \$70,000 in federal ARPA grant funds to help fund operations for this winter. The resolution notes that Strafford County and the tri-cities are seeking proposals from entities capable of operating the Warming Center on an as-needed basis during the 2023-2024 winter months. The City of Dover owns the Warming Center at 30 Willand Drive, which it purchased in 2020 with grant funds. The Warming Center is intended to provide for the safety of those in need during extreme winter weather events.

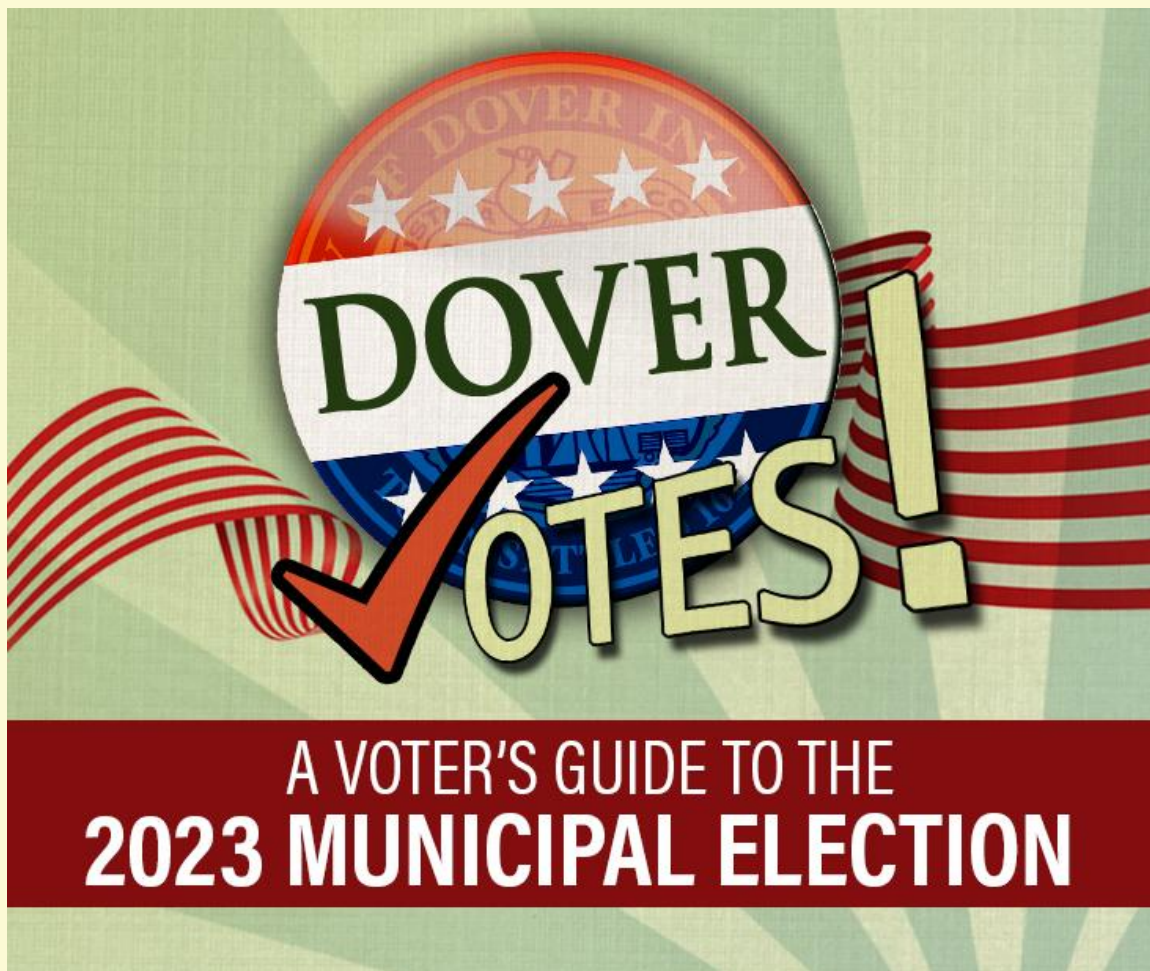
The City Council will also consider a resolution that would award a bid to Martini Northern for design-build services for an expansion of the public works facility on Mast Road for office space for Inspection Services. The city has investigated the space issues needed for Inspection Services and found them ineffective. Inspection Services' space needs was discussed at a June 7 City Council workshop, [available here](#).

Informational session on Community Power to be held Monday at City Hall

Details about program mailed this week

The Community Power Coalition of New Hampshire is now enrolling residents and businesses into the Dover Community Program.

To help inform the public about the program, the City of Dover is hosting an informational session on Monday, Sept. 25, at 6 p.m. in City Hall's Council Conference Room.

This week, informational mailers about the Dover Community Power Program were sent to city residents and businesses.



Residents with the default supplier service from Eversource will be automatically enrolled in the program, which will begin in November. Residents not wanting to enroll must contact Community Power to opt-out. The current Community Power default rate is 10.9 cents per kilowatt hour; the default Eversource rate is 12.582 cents per kWh.

Residents utilizing a competitive supplier will not be automatically enrolled; however, these customers may opt in anytime.

Those who receive the Electric Assistance Program discount will continue to receive these benefits. Those who have elected Budget Billing can remain on it, but the budget will restart when enrolled in Community Power, which may cause a credit or charge. Call 1-866-603-POWR (7697) for more information.

For net-metered customers, please note that Eversource cannot share net-metering export data with Dover Community Power and provide credit for such exported power, so Dover Community Power can't properly serve most net-metered customers.

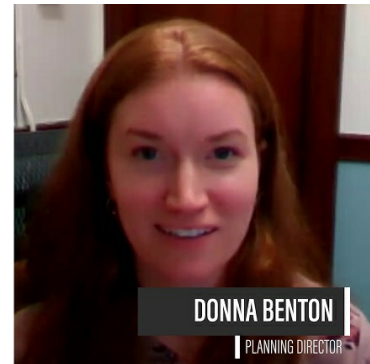

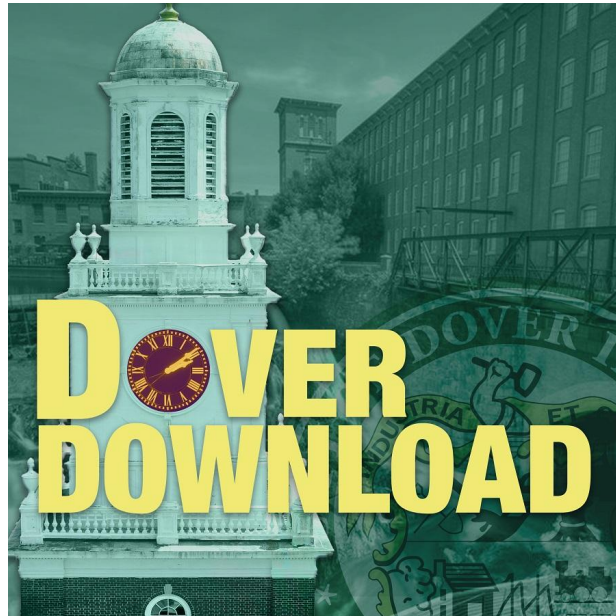

'Voices of Dover' series: Phil and Donna Rinaldi

Dover400's Voices of Dover oral history video series continues this week with longtime Dover residents and business owners Phil and Donna Rinaldi.

In their [interview](#), the Rinaldis discussed their family histories and how they came to settle in Dover. Phil's grandfather immigrated from Italy in the early 1900s and started several businesses in downtown Dover. Donna moved to Dover as a teenager when her stepfather was stationed at Pease Air Force Base.

The Rinaldis also describe their over 40 years of owning and operating Dover Secretarial Services and extensive community involvement with organizations like the Greater Dover Chamber of Commerce, Rotary Club, school committees, and the Woodman Museum.

The "Voices of Dover" series captures personal stories and recollections from current citizens about Dover's history, culture, businesses, and people. According to the 400th Anniversary Committee, the goal is to "honor our past, celebrate our present, and inspire our future through meaningful community engagement." This personal glimpse into Dover's past through the eyes of longtime residents like the Rinaldis captures the city's rich history and community spirit. The "Voices of Dover" series is important in honoring Dover's 400 years and engaging citizens in the anniversary celebration.

Sept. 28, 1703 — The first snow of the season falls, accompanied by very cold temperatures.

Sept. 29, 1820 — Died, the Hon. William King Atkinson, aged 56. He was born in Portsmouth, and was a nephew of George King, who inherited the property of Theodore Atkinson who died in 1779. George King was a relative of Atkinson and changed his name to George Atkinson when he became his heir. He died without issue, and the large entailed Atkinson estate became the property of his nephew, William King, who also assumed the name of Atkinson. William King Atkinson graduated at Harvard College in 1783, commenced the practice of law in Dover about 1786, was Register of Probate from 1787 to 1819, Attorney General of the State, and Judge of the Superior Court, and from his large wealth and official position was for many years one of Dover's most eminent citizens.

Sept. 29, 1922 — A Brentwood man is arrested, tried and fined \$30 for driving his automobile faster than 25 miles per hour on Central Avenue.

Sept. 25, 1983 — (From the New York Times) Cathy Schiro (now Cathy O'Brien), a 16-year-old from Dover, N.H., surprised veteran distance runners yesterday when she led for nearly the entire race and won the Avon Half Marathon at Central Park. Her time for the 13.1-mile event was 1 hour 13 minutes 19 seconds, a United States junior women's record for the half marathon and more than 2 minutes faster than that of second-place Isabelle Carmichael. "She just kinda snuck in there," Miss Carmichael, 33, who finished in 1:15.44, said of Miss Schiro. "I said, 'Wow, who is that little person?' She passed me early, at two miles, then she was way ahead, and that was the last we ever saw of her."

Sept. 23, 2000 — Jenny Thompson won her eighth career Olympic gold medal on this day in Sydney, Australia -- her 10th medal overall at that time -- in the 400-meter medley relay race as the United States set a world record in the swimming event.



Dover Library to screen 'Champions,' host disability rights talk

The Dover Public Library and ABLE NH are teaming up this October to celebrate National Disability Employment Awareness Month and explore the accomplishments and importance of equal opportunities for all abilities.

On Saturday, Sept. 30 at 1 p.m., the library will host a free screening of the PG-13-rated film "Champions," starring Woody Harrelson. The two-hour, four-minute film follows a former minor league basketball coach ordered by the court to coach a team of players with intellectual disabilities. He soon realizes the team can go further than imagined despite his doubts.

A panel discussion featuring ABLE NH staff and people with lived experience in the disability community will follow the film. ABLE NH is New Hampshire's only disability justice organization, advocating for the civil and human rights of children and adults with disabilities. It promotes full participation by improving support systems, connecting families, inspiring communities, and influencing public policy.

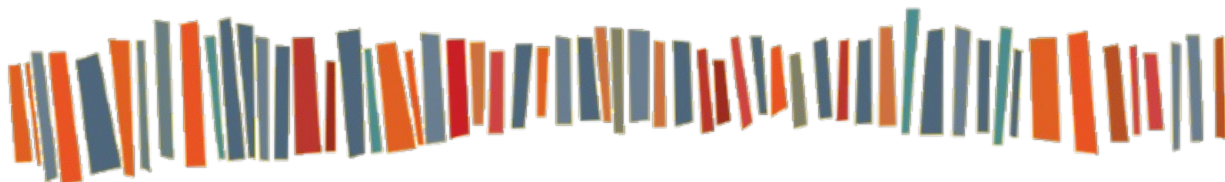
